On April 10, 2010 Dave Battagello of the Windsor Star reported the following quotes.

Dr. Wajid Ahmed, medical officer of health for the Windsor-Essex County Health Unit:

"As a persons of science, we stay up to date on all research and areas we work with," Ahmed said. "We look at the results and based our recommendations on that. One research paper does not negate longstanding research that dates back 73 years that shows fluoride is safe."

Tecumseh Mayor Gary McNamara:

"A lot of it was repetitive, but I must say I'm proud how council did their homework on this and based their decision on good science.... The reality is the science is solid and peer-reviewed."
