I require access to records per the California Public Records Act.

Description of Requested Records:

1. All records that contain litigation/legal/court expenses/fees/costs/expenditures incurred thus far by Orange County in defending the following "covid-19"-related lawsuit:

2. All studies/reports in the possession, custody or control of the institution that scientifically prove/provide evidence of the existence of the alleged "covid-19 virus" aka "SARS-COV2" (showing that the alleged particles with the purported genome and proteins exist and have been found in sick people and cause the illness/symptoms that they are alleged to cause).

Note:

Scientific proof/evidence is NOT

Thank you for your email, David.

Regarding part 1 of my request, I believe you may have made an error in your response because the request is not specific or exclusive to confidential communications between a client and lawyer and thus attorney-client privilege should be irrelevant to some of the records. Therefore I ask that you assist me, per section 7922.600 of the Government Code:

- (1) Assist the member of the public to identify records and information that are responsive to the request or to the purpose of the request, if stated.
- (2) Describe the information technology and physical location in which the records exist.
- (3) Provide suggestions for overcoming any practical basis for denying access to the records or information sought.

Also. regarding confidential communications between client and lawyer I'm not aware of anyone having claimed, per section 954 of the Evidence Code, the privilege to refuse to disclose or to prevent another from disclosing the requested records, or of the client having exercised the privilege, and your email makes no demonstration of this having happened. Therefore your email seems not to satisfy Section 7922.000 of the Government Code, which states that "an agency shall justify withholding any record by demonstrating that the record in question is exempt under express provisions of this division..."

Finally, I would like to respectfully point out that the court case in question relates to an alleged "virus" for which the County has already confessed to having no valid scientific evidence (becoming the **223rd institution** to have done so) and an allegedly contagious illness for which the County has already confessed to having no valid scientific evidence of contagion, and that section 956 (a) of the Evidence Code states that "There is no privilege under this article if the services of the lawyer were sought or obtained to enable or aid anyone to commit or plan to commit a crime or a fraud."
