Greetings Roger,

I require access to general records, as per the *Freedom of Information Act*.**Description of Requested Records:**

1. All studies/reports in the possession, custody or control of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and/or the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR) that scientifically prove/provide evidence of the existence of any alleged:

Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV), or
Feline Leukemia Virus (FeLV), or
Feline Coronavirus (FCoV), or
Feline Panleukopenia Virus (FPV), or
Feline Herpesvirus (FHV), or
Feline Calicivirus (FCV), or
Rabies virus

(showing that the alleged particles exist and cause the illness/symptoms that they are alleged to cause).

Note:

Scientific proof/evidence is NOT

- opinions, speculation, declarations, or
- review papers, or
- descriptive studies.

Scientific proof/evidence requires use of the scientific method to test falsifiable hypotheses through valid, rigorous, repeatable controlled experiments.

2. **If the institution has no studies responsive to #1 above**, then please indicate such explicitly, and provide all studies and/or reports in the possession, custody or control of the institution describing the **purification** of particles that are alleged to be said "virus", directly **from bodily fluid/tissue/excrement of sick cats, with purification confirmed via EM imaging** (the images must be available as well).

Please note that I am not requesting studies/reports where researchers failed to purify the suspected "viruses" and instead:

- added a clinical sample or other unpurified substance to a starved/poisoned/stressed cell line and observed cytopathic effects, and/or
- performed an amplification test (i.e. a PCR test), and/or
- created an in silico "genome", and/or
- produced electron microscopy images of unpurified things.

I am aware that according to "virus" dogma a "virus" requires host cells in order to replicate; I am not seeking records describing the replication of a "virus" without host cells, or that describe a suspected "virus" floating in a vacuum or a strict fulfillment of Koch's Postulate; I am simply seeking records that describe its purification (**separation from everything else in the "host" sample**). I am not seeking private patient records.


Fee Category

NCEZID Personnel provided further information regarding your request.

For point 1 of your request, the information you are seeking requires that a study followed Koch's postulates. These studies are not routinely conducted at CDC, and historical studies are published in the public domain for numerous species. To our knowledge CDC has not conducted these studies in cats.

For point 2, CDC routinely conducts direct antigenic testing and molecular testing of rabies virus in a range of species, including cats. EM is not routinely conducted and to our knowledge there are no EM images from cats in CDC's possession.


For point 3, computer processing is a standard component of molecular diagnostic methods.

For point 4, CDC does not collect clinical sign information for rabid animals detected through the National Rabies Surveillance System. This information may be available from state health departments, who conduct rabies case investigations. CDC does not conduct this kind of work.

Greetings Roger,

Thank you for your letter confessing that the "experts" at the CDC have no scientific evidence on hand, from anyone anywhere, for any of the listed and alleged feline viruses or contagion, or even the existence of purported "genomes", dated October 29, 2024. However there are serious problems with the remainder of your response and said problems suggest either a profound lack of logic or criminal intent to protect criminal activities.

You wrote:

"For point 1 of your request... These studies are not routinely conducted at CDC... To our knowledge CDC has not conducted these studies in cats."

This statement is irrelevant and distracting. You already confessed to having no such records authored by anyone anywhere. As stated in my FOIA order:

"This FOI is *not limited to records that were authored by the CDC or ATSDR or that pertain to work done at/by the CDC or ATSDR*, it includes any record matching the above description authored by anyone, anywhere, ever..."

You wrote:

"...historical studies are published in the public domain for numerous species."

There are no valid scientific historical studies showing that any alleged virus exists. I challenge you to prove your claim by citing even 1 such study. Silence will be interpreted as your tacit admission that none exist, anywhere and that you are incompetent or intentionally misleading.

You wrote:

"For point 2, CDC routinely conducts direct antigenic testing and molecular testing of rabies virus in a range of species, including cats. EM is not routinely conducted and to our knowledge there are no EM images from cats in CDC's possession."

See above and thank you for the confession that to your knowledge the supposed experts at the CDC have no EM images showing anything purported to be a virus in any cat on Earth, whatsoever.

Regarding "tests", you put the cart before the horse. It is impossible to conduct a **valid** test for a virus that was never shown to exist. The "experts" at CDC conduct fraudulent, invalid tests for an imaginary virus that they cannot even show exists. I would have stood corrected if you had provided or cited valid scientific evidence showing that these viruses actually exist. That is the whole point of my FOIA order.

You wrote:

"For point 3, computer processing is a standard component of molecular diagnostic methods."
